





Washington County Farm and Fiber Tour



Wool and other fiber production in Washington County has a rich heritage dating to the 1800s, and over the past decades has enjoyed a vibrant renaissance. You can meet today's fiber farmers nearly every kind of fiber animal there is during the 21st annual Washington County Fiber Tour on April 27 and 28, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. This self-guided

Tour of 17 farms and a fiber mill is free and open to the public. While visiting the farms, enjoy the beautiful scenery, the friendly villages, and the opportunity to see many fiber arts in action, all within an easy driving distance of the Capital District and nearby western New England.

With the addition of new farms that raise angora and cashmere goats, along with returning and other new farms that raise several breeds of sheep, furry angora rabbits and elegant alpacas, the Washington County Fiber Tour has it all. Farmers across the county will introduce you to their livestock and answer all your questions about the care of these animals and the uses of their valuable fiber. The five new farms joining the Tour this year are: Celtic Farm Alpacas in Granville, Sweet Dreams Sheep Farm in Hebron, Blind Buck Angora Goat Farm in Salem, the cashmere goat flock at Christ the King Spiritual Life Center in Easton, and September Morning Alpacas in Buskirk.

The Fiber Tour also offers a good chance to learn about the fiber arts and to try your hand at a new technique. Most farms will offer educational demonstrations and fun workshops throughout the weekend, showcasing a variety of fiber arts suitable for children and adults. Some of the hands-on opportunities that will engage your whole family include making felted soaps and trivets at

Our local commercial fiber mill Battenkill Fibers will be open all weekend for tours, offering a rare behind-the-scenes glimpse of an essential aspect of the fiber world. Visitors will observe the many steps, the complicated equipment, and the skilled labor needed to turn shorn fleeces into premium yarn for knitting or weaving.

For visitors who want to buy local, the on-farm shops open during the Washington County Fiber Tour are well known for the high quality products they offer. After all, what could be better than purchasing fiber products directly from the farm or mill that produced them? Fleeces, roving, yarns, as well as many finished articles will be available for purchase at most locations along the Tour. Several farms also have breeding stock for sale.

The Fiber Tour takes place rain or shine and visitors should dress for the weather. Visit www.washingtoncountyfibertour.org for details about the farms and specific activities being offered. Antique Fair Coming in May

Fairground Shows NY is pleased to announce their Antique Fairs for 2013. The first event will be held on May 4th and 5th, just one week before the Brimfield antique shows.

The second Antique Fair at the fairgrounds is scheduled for August 3rd and 4th, during the height of the Saratoga Springs racing season.

Greenwich is ideally situated for these events, just 30 miles north of the Albany/Troy/Schenectady area, and 12 miles east of the famous resort city of Saratoga Springs. Lake George is less than 20 miles away. The surrounding area is heavily steeped in colonial American History. The historic Saratoga Battlefield is only 3 miles from the fairground.

The Antique Fair features an average of over 200 dealers from all over the northeast, specializing in a wide variety of antiques, collectibles, crafts, and flea market items. Furniture, Post Cards, Art, Glassware, Tools, Linens, Records, Paper, Coins, Toys, and Smalls can be found at this event. Over 90% of our exhibitors specialize in antiques and older collectibles.

The public's weekend ticket (also good for unlimited show reentries) is only \$3. Seniors 65+ are only \$2, and children under 14 are admitted free. Public gates open at 8am on Saturday, and 9am Sunday.

Early Buyers can enter the grounds with the dealers during setup (Friday) using a \$10 early buyer pass available at the gate beginning at 6am, plus unlimited re-entries during public



hours throughout the rest of the weekend.

There are acres of free parking at the fairgrounds, and camping facilities for those staying overnight. There is a porter service that can deliver your purchases to the gate area during show hours. Several dealers also provide appraisals for your antiques. Leashed pets are also welcome.

Food vendors are carefully screened and they are chosen for their cleanliness, reasonable pricing and menu choices. These vendors provide a wide variety of foods featuring specialty items as well as family favorites.

13th Annual Balloon Festival, June 7,8 & 9

The Cambridge community is gearing up for its 13th Annual Cambridge Valley Balloon Festival, set for Friday, June 7 through Sunday, June 9, 2013, in and around the beautiful historic Village of Cambridge, NY.

The Cambridge Valley Chamber of Commerce, organizer of the event, is putting together the schedule of activities, which will include four launches of 10 hot air balloons (Friday & Saturday evening and Saturday & Sunday morning). All launches take place at the Cambridge Central School on Route 22 (wind and weather permitting). Evening launches typically occur between 6:30-7:30 p.m.; morning launches between 5:30-6:30 a.m. Spectators are invited to watch from a distance or walk

Between the launches, the Cambridge community throws out the red carpet and provides a myriad of activities to entertain the crowds. Community businesses, through the Chamber, host a fantastic fireworks display on Friday evening at the Cambridge Guest Home Park on South Union Street.

On Saturday, the Chamber organizes a "Taste of Cambridge" at the same location to showcase local food producers and restaurants. The "Taste" is followed by the annual Moon Glow, a spectacular night time display of tethered





hot air balloons that are lit from inside in time to music.



Local organizations augment the festival with activities to entertain crowds between the launches and to showcase the Cambridge community. 

Weeklong activities include carnival rides, great music, family entertainment, thrilling motor sports, great food, and great performances along with 170 + commercial exhibits and more.




