Encampment Salutes Battle of Saratoga Anniversary

STILLWATER — On Saturday and Sunday, September 17-18, Saratoga National Historical Park, located on Routes 32 and 4 in Stillwater, will present an 18th century living history encampment marking the 239th anniversary of the world's "most important battle of the last 1,000 years." Camps will be open Saturday from 9 to 4 p.m., and on Sunday from 10 to 3 p.m.

This two-day encampment will surround visitors with the sights, smells, and sounds of military camp life from the American Revolution. Dozens of re-enactors portray American and British officers, soldiers, cavalry troops, and camp followers from the Battles of Saratoga. See cavalry charge, join in a court-martial and decide the soldier's fate, take part in a musket drill, follow along with a scouting party, or listen to stories of the revolutionary war experience. Feel the thunderous roar of cannons, smell the acrid smoke of musket fire as well as the welcoming wisps of camp cooking fires. Immerse yourself in the wonder of camp life in earliest America!

On Sunday, there will be a 2 p.m. Wreath Laying Ceremony by Sons of the American Revolution and Daughters of the American Revolution at Tour Road Stop 2. The public is welcome to attend this commemorative wreath laying.



The event is free, but the normal entrance fee to the park of \$5 per car and \$3 per hiker or cyclist (good for one week entry) is charged. Part of the "Hoosick Comes Full Circle" community arts guild project, the windchimes were crafted by local residents from a variety of materials and all featuring a circular theme. The windchimes will be on display along the Greenway until October 25. A map of the trail and windchime locations will be available at the Hullabaloo information table.

Throughout the day a number of events and activities will take place in Wood



Saturday's festivities will conclude with the 'Hoosick is Illuminated' parade line up at Wood Memorial Park at 7 p.m. and starting at 7:30p.m. Parade Community members and organizations are encouraged to participate at no cost. Bikes, trucks, wagons, unicycles, if you can ride it or walk with it covered in lights, you can be a part of it. The parade will conclude at Wood Park where The Brewster Family will perform beginning at 8 p.m.

A luminary lantern launch (available while they last) will take place in front of Wood Park at 8:30 p.m.

GREENWICH – The Southern Adirondack Fiber Festival is proud to announce that it will be celebrating its 8th year of keeping fiber arts and natural fiber production in the Southern Adirondack region alive and well. Each year producers, craftsmen and artist gather to display and sell their wares. Demonstrating their skills they educate the public about natural fibers and their importance to our community

This year's festival will run September 24 & 25, 2016 (10 a.m. to 5 p.m.) and is offering the more than 4,000 attendees a variety of products made in the southern Adirondack region.

Hoosick's annual Suicide Prevention Walk not only gives the community the opportunity to give a communal hug to families and friends who are heartbroken from the loss of a loved one by suicide, but it reminds community members that they matter! This year's walk will take place on Sunday, October 2, 2016 and steps off at 6:30pm from the north entrance of the Hoosic River Greenway (across from Riverside Laundromat). 

Forest Corridor Study at Dionondehowa

SHUSHAN – This study of Forest/Wildlife Corridors will focus on Dionondehowa's role when considering regional and local corridors. This study is born of the 2015 Dionondehowa Newsletter article regarding the Smithsonian Magazine, September 2014 article "The Wildest Idea on Earth" through which we learned of David Hunt's active participation in remote analyses to identify specific Northeast corridors.

On September 10 from 1-4PM an applied overview of forest corridors is planned, at Dionondehowa, to demonstrate how to model and predict areas thought to be regionally important to native wildlife and plant movement. This study will begin

indoors with background information provided to explain the definition and role of forest corridors. Maps at various scales will point out the level of importance of corridors from multiple scales ranging from the NE US region to the local vicinity (within about five miles) of the Sanctuary. Maps prepared by Smithsonian for the Northeast will be shown first, as well as maps by The Nature Conservancy for New York State, and maps designed by Dr. Hunt for the nearby Adirondack and Rensselaer Plateau regions of New York. These regional maps will be applied at a more refined scale, showing forest cover on a topographic map, for the local area where we will delineate a forest corridor passing through a portion of the Sanctuary that is predicted to be important for the broader regional movement of wildlife. We will then explore that area on the ground, looking for signs of animal tracks and sharing local information on wildlife observed in that area during the past. These skills can be used to help identify important forest corridors in other landscapes, with the intention of empowering people to help maintain those corridors and minimize future fragmentation.








Hudson Valley Ruins Photography Exhibition

ALBANY - The New York State Museum opened Hudson Valley Ruins, a photography and architecture exhibition which is on display through December 31. The exhibition features over 80 photographs by Robert Yasinsac and Thomas Rinaldi documenting forgotten historic sites and cultural treasures in the Hudson River Valley.

"Hudson Valley Ruins is a powerful visual convergence of place and history," said State Museum Director Mark Schaming. "Yasinsac and Rinaldi's masterful photographs richly echo the past and invite viewers to better understand the history of the Hudson Valley through its forgotten cultural treasures. The State Museum is pleased to host this exhibition and hope visitors leave with an understanding of how these historic sites shaped

the landscape of the Hudson Valley."

The exhibition is based on Yasinsac and Rinaldi's 2006 book, Hudson Valley Ruins: Forgotten Landmarks of an American Landscape. In addition to great river estates, the book and exhibition profiles sites meaningful to everyday life in the Valley: churches, hotels, commercial and civic buildings, mills, and train stations. The exhibition explores many of these abandoned places and also revisits several

Working together since meeting in 1999, Yasinsac and Rinaldi have photographed more

than 500 sites throughout the region. First photographing sites around their childhood homes, they gradually worked farther afield, eventually expanding their scope to cover the entire region between Yonkers and







Celebrating 200 Years of Church & Community - October 15 & 16, 2016

FORT MILLER - In an age where buildings, photos and messages disappear in an instant, the celebration of a community and church complex that has existed for 200 years is an event not to be missed.

On Saturday and Sunday, October 15 & 16, 2016, the greater Fort Miller community will host a birthday celebration to commemorate the beginnings of what is now considered

an "intact example of a 19th century church & community complex." The complex, listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1996, was built on land given the community by the Bleeker family of Albany. Descendants of the Bleeker family are expected to speak during the celebration.

The weekend of festivities begin on Saturday morning with long time organist and

music director, Debbie Anderson opening the celebration. The musical prelude will be played on the hybrid pipe organ located in the church's balcony. The organ was updated for sound amplification and donated by Jim Petit who served as church organist for 50 years before turning the reins over to Mrs. Anderson in the

1990's.

Malcolm Sanders who grew up attending the church sermons and now serves as the main archivist will provide an overview of the buildings uses over the years. It began as a meetinghouse open for all Protestant denominations. In 1822, the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church was formed and remains active to this day. Local historians from the Washington County and Fort Miller Historical Societies will talk about Fort Miller as a community both before 1816 and through the present day.

Given the beauty of the church's architecture, Bill Krattinger of the NYS Department Of Historic Preservation will share his knowledge of why the complex was added to the National Register of Historic Places.

Yet perhaps the most important part of the celebration is looking to the future of the church complex's uses and its impact. In an era where many small, tolerant and all accepting church communities of faith struggle to survive and grow their membership, the Fort Miller Reformed Church is unique in its strength and longevity. As it prepares to celebrate 200 years as a community resource for various denominations, groups and families, they invite the greater community of Washington & Warren Counties and beyond to join them as they look to the next 200 years.

The formal presentations will be followed by a tour of the historic artifacts, family friendly activities and a light fare luncheon of fall inspired foods and drinks. Read apple cider, donuts, pumpkin breads and a birthday cake worthy of celebrating 200 years of community.
