


HOOSICK FALLS – The Hoosick Falls St Patrick's Parade and Irish Fest will celebrate its 27th Anniversary on March 17th, 2018. local Irishmen Mike Conway and TJ Carmody wanted to find a way to keep the Irish Culture and history alive in the Hoosick area, and decided that a parade was the ticket!

The history of the St Patrick's Day Parade dates back to when Irish immigrants made their way to Hoosick Falls in the mid 1800s and ended sometime in the 1950s. In 1991 the parade started again.

Each year the parade has grown to what it has become today and the Irish Fest has become a First Night like event. The day begins at 12:00 PM with over 40 Marching Units and Floats and is followed by the Irish Fest Irish dance and music.

The Parade and Irish Fest have become the single largest one-day event in the Town of Hoosick with two to three thousand visitors that day. It is also the best day of year for local for local bars, Restaurants and Shops.

"We're inviting area families to come and experience first-hand the sights, smells and sounds of maple sugar-making," said David Campbell, a Salem producer and president of the Upper Hudson Maple Producers Association.

"The event has become so successful that we have expanded it to three weekends, giving folks more opportunity to come visit sugarhouses," he said.

Signs will be placed along roadsides over the course of the weekend to direct motorists to the sugarhouses. The sugarhouses will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day.

Most sugarhouses will offer samples and demonstrations. Many of the locations will be serving pancakes breakfasts as well.

Sugarhouses participating in the event are located throughout Washington, Warren, Saratoga, Rensselaer, Fulton and Montgomery Counties.

Tapping Ceremony

A tree tapping ceremony to kick-off the event will be held or Friday, March 18, at 12 noon at Maple Acres at 49 Searles Road in Granville. The farm is owned by Chris and Elizabeth Truso State and local officials are invited to participate.

Maple season generally runs from now through the middle of April. The Upper Hudson region is among the largest syrup producing areas in New York



Robert Mulligan to Portray Union Soldier Rice Bull

CAMBRIDGE – On Sunday afternoon, April 15, 2018 at 2 p.m. the Washington County Historical Society will present Robert Mulligan portraying Rice Bull, a soldier in the Union Army, 123rd Regiment Co. D. (Washington County, NY), The presentation will be in the Freight Depot Theater behind Hubbard Hall on East Main Street in Cambridge.

Rice Cook Bull was born in Hartford, NY on June 9, 1842. At the age of 19 years he joined Company D of the 123rd NYS Volunteers on August 13, 1862. Bull settled in Troy after the war, married and became a respected businessman and civil leader. His account of his service, written fifty years after the event in 1913, reposes in the Rensselaer County Historical Society. It was edited by Professor K. Jack Bauer, of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and published in 1977 as Soldiering, the Civil War Diary of Rice C. Bull. It is not a diary, but a memoir, and one of the best ever published by a soldier of the Union Army.

Mulligan Jr. Robert E. was born in Albany, NY and graduated from SUNYA and the Cooperstown Graduate Program in Museum Studies. He was for a quarter century the Military Curator of the NYS Museum. One of his hobbies was "reenacting" soldier life of the Civil War. He knew Professor Bauer, and developed a program based upon Bauer's publication of Bull's harrowing account of his wounding at Chancellorsville, and the eleven days Bull spent as a prisoner of war, without medical attention.

Mulligan, now retired, has given this "recreation" of a lecture Bull "might" have given in 1913, to numerous local audiences.



All launches take place at the Cambridge Central School on Route 22 (wind and weather permitting). Evening launches typically occur around 7 p.m.; morning launches at 5:30 a.m.
