
Author Event: Special Since '92: The Story of Cambridge Football


CAMBRIDGE - For 28 years the Agricultural Stewardship Association (ASA) has worked to accomplish a singular mission: protect the farms, rich soils and agricultural landscape in Washington and Rensselaer counties for future generations. In that time they've managed to conserve 112 farms and 17,500 acres. For the last 16 years, a significant source of funding for this mission has come from Landscapes for Landsake Art Sale and Exhibition, a celebration of the land by the community of local artists.

The sale takes place in the historic barn at Maple Ridge, 172 State Route 372 in the hamlet of Coila, just west of the Village of Cambridge. The show opens with a wine and cheese reception on Saturday, October 6th from 12 to 5 p.m. Admission is \$10 per person. The gallery is also open from noon to 4 p.m. on Sunday and Monday free of charge.

Landscapes for Landsake is the region's largest art buying event of the season and ASA's largest fundraiser of the year. Participating artists generously donate fifty percent of their proceeds to support ASA's farmland conservation work. Funds raised from the sale directly benefit regional projects. For the past fifteen years the success of this event has had a tremendous impact on ASA's ability to protect local farms.
