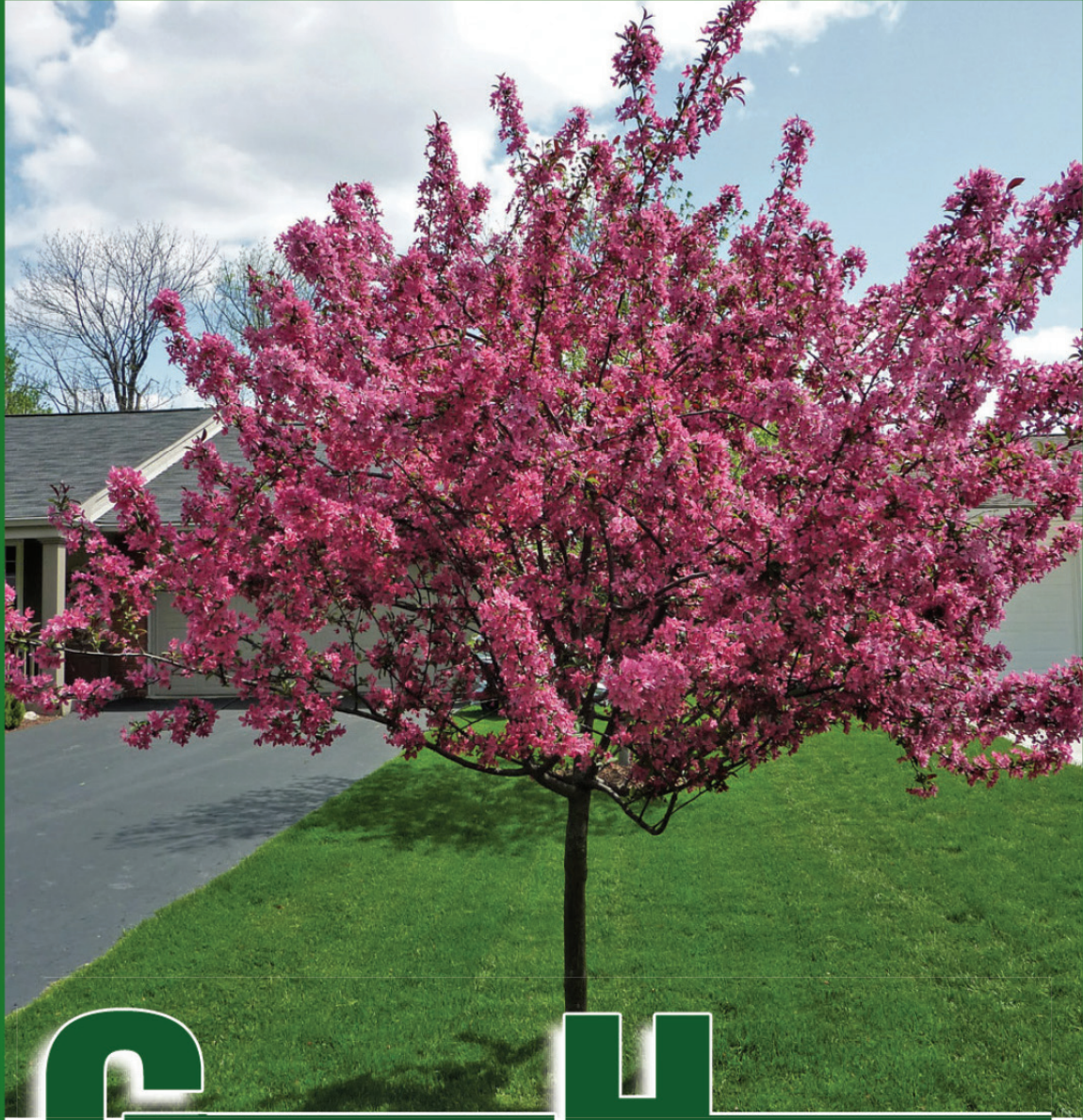

Chamber Music Series Celebrating 15 Years

SALEM - Chamber Music at the Historic Salem Courthouse, now entering its 15th season, will present music by the masters on 3 Sunday afternoons this spring. On April 3rd, the season opener will feature violinist Kaori Washiyama and pianist Daniel Shulman in works by Bach and Mozart, as well as Chopin and Schubert.

On April 24th, Washiyama and Shulman will be joined by violinist Andrea Schultz and cellist Michael Finckel to play Robert Schumann's Quintet for Piano and Strings, Op. 44. Continuing with Schubert, this program also features Mr. Shulman performing the exquisite G Major Piano Sonata, Op. 78, written during the composer's mature final years, just before the age of 30!

On May 15th, the spring season finale is highlighted by Schubert's monumental and magnificent Piano Trio in E-flat, Op. 100. Cellist Maxine Neumann, who will also be heard in Faure's "Elegy," is the guest artist. More than a curiosity, though a relative rarity on concert programs anywhere, is Bartok's demanding Sonata for Solo Violin, composed with Bach in the background. It will be performed by Ms. Washiyama.

These events are friendly occasions with high-quality music that is both accessible and uplifting. The concerts allow for neighbors to gather and are a welcome respite from the trials and tribulations of the world. Please plan to join us.

29th Annual Washington County Fiber Tour

Since the early 1800s, Washington County has been a welcoming home for wool and other fiber production. Join us as we celebrate the 29th annual Washington County Fiber Tour on April 23-24, 2022.

During each day of the tour, you can visit alpacas, bunnies, goats, sheep and lambs, llamas, and more - on the farm; and meet the farmers and their families. This self-guided tour of ten farms fiber mills is free and open to the public. Farms are open both days from 10:00AM - 4:00PM unless otherwise noted on the event's official website.

Many of the Tour's fiber farmers exhibit their animals and products nationally, where they have won major awards at events like the Eastern States Exposition, the NYS Sheep and Wool Festival, the New England area North American Cashmere Goat Show, the Empire Alpaca Extravaganza, and the Southern Adirondack Fiber Festival. Enjoy the unique opportunity to learn from farmers throughout the county as they introduce you to their livestock and answer questions about their animals and the myriad uses of the fibers that they produce.

The Fiber Tour also offers the chance for visitors to learn about



the fiber arts and to try their hand at a new craft technique. Most farms offer educational demonstrations and fun workshops throughout the weekend, showcasing a variety of fiber arts suitable for children and adults.

The Fiber Tour takes place rain or shine and visitors should dress for the weather.

20th Annual Cambridge Valley Balloon Festival ~ June 3-5



CAMBRIDGE – Following a two-year pandemic induced hiatus the Cambridge Valley Chamber of Commerce has announced the Cambridge Valley Balloon Festival is returning for its 20th year!

The chamber is putting together the schedule of festival activities, which will include four launches of hot air balloons Friday & Saturday evening and Saturday & Sunday morning; June 3-5. All launches take place at the Cambridge Central School on Route 22 (wind and weather permitting). Evening launches typically occur around 7 p.m.; morning launches at 5:30 a.m.

FESTIVAL POSTER

For the first time in many years there will be a balloon festival poster by folk artist Will Moses to commemorate 20th annual balloon festival. The posters will be available for purchase throughout the event.

LOTS TO DO FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

Between the launches, the Cambridge community throws out the red carpet and provides a myriad of activities to entertain the crowds.

Community businesses, through the Chamber, host a fantastic firework display on Friday evening at the Mansion at South Union Park on South Union Street.

On Saturday, the Chamber organizes a "Taste of Cambridge" at the same location to showcase local food producers and restaurants. The "Taste" is followed by the annual Moon Glow, a spectacular night time display of tethered hot air balloons that are lit from inside in time to music.

Sunday brings an end to the

official festival activities with a Pilots Breakfast at the American Legion on Route 22 in Cambridge. This is a great opportunity to meet the pilots and discuss the details of ballooning with the experts.

Local organizations augment the festival with activities to entertain crowds between the launches and to showcase the Cambridge community. At the school location there are rides, carnival games, food vendors,

and sporting events.

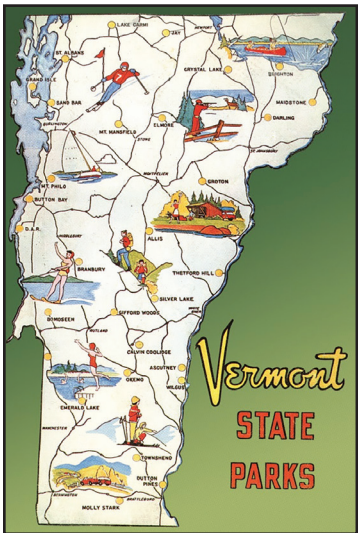

Bennington Museum Exhibit on State Parks



BENNINGTON - Bennington Museum's major 2022 exhibit will explore the history and artistic depictions of Vermont's state parks and other formally designated natural areas. From state forests to the Green Mountain National Forest, and the Appalachian Trail/Long Trail, these preserved and sometimes curated spaces provide year-round outdoor activities (and tourism) for skiers/snowboarders in the winter, and hikers and fishers from spring through autumn. Parks and the recreation opportunities they provide are

an integral aspect of the state's identity in the public imagination.

The exhibition will trace the history of Vermont's wildscapes from the origins of nature tourism in the region in the mid-nineteenth century through the formal development of a state park system and national forest designation beginning in the 1920s through the 1940s. This exhibition connects past to present through thematically relevant artworks including Sanford Gifford's painting of hikers/campers on top of Mt. Historical Society to Discuss "Twelve Years a Slave"

FORT EDWARD - Washington County Historical Society's local history book club will meet at noon on Friday, April 8, in the Old Fort House Museum, 29 Lower Broadway, Fort Edward. This location is for this meeting only. The club meets on the second Friday of the month.

April's discussion will focus on "Twelve Years a Slave," published in 1853. This is the true story of Solomon Northup, who was born and raised as a free man in New York. His father, Mintus, had been manumitted by Capt. Henry Northup's will in 1797, in Hoosic. Solomon, a talented carpenter and violinist, lived from 1828 to 1832 with his young wife, Anne, in what is now the Old Fort House Museum. From there the family moved to Saratoga where Solomon's wife was employed as a cook at the United States Hotel during the tourist season while Solomon worked elsewhere in the city. Then one day in 1841, after being offered employment as a violinist, Solomon was drugged, kidnapped, and sold into slavery in the deep south. This book is his detailed account of the twelve-year ordeal before he was rescued by Henry B. Northup, a lawyer from Sandy Hill. The book was published only a few months after his rescue, not long after Stowe's "Uncle Tom's Cabin." Over 30,000 copies were sold before 1860.

The May 13th meeting of the

book club will focus on two works by Hollis Palmer of Saratoga, "Maggie's Revenge" and "To Spend Eternity Alone." Both feature unsolved murders in our local area. Mr. Palmer will be the speaker at the Greenwich Free Library on June 7 at 7 PM, sponsored by the Washington Co. Historical Society.

Future selections will include books about the larger Adirondack
