





A New Gallery for Grandma Moses

BENNINGTON - Thanks to the major infusion of funds from the winter Gala, Bennington Museum has begun a significant renovation project in a signature gallery, devoted to the work, life, and legacy of Anna Mary "Robertson" Moses. From January through March the Museum is traditionally closed to the public for a winter break. The Museum is taking that opportunity to update, expand, and fully reinstall the Moses Gallery, with

old favorites and new. There will be a premiere celebration on March 28 just before the Museum reopens to the public.

At the core of the reinstallation will be 5 masterpieces by Moses that have been newly acquired from the Kallir Research Institute.
